



# ECONOMICS AND CORPORATE ENGLISH

**The Economics and Corporate English is a Bachelor's degree in Economics coupled with intensive English language course.**

## The Objectives

The Bachelor's degree in Economics covers economics, finance and business administration. The hands-on training in English represents a real asset in the job market.

## Students enrolled in this course enjoy excellent conditions

- Capped size class (25 students) for better faculty-student relations.
- No lecture classes for major subjects (microeconomics, macroeconomics, maths).
- Intensive 88-hour language course (around 8 hours a week) focused on the four linguistic skills (speaking, writing, listening, reading).
- Some classes in economics, finance or business administration are taught in English as of Sophomore year.
- The last semester of the Bachelor's Degree in Economics is spent abroad as a visiting student in one of the University of Cergy Pontoise's partner universities or colleges, Canada, Brasil, China, Korea, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Germany, Spain.
- Optional training classes to get ready for business schools's admission tests.

## Pre-requisites

Applicants should be high-school majors in Economics or Maths. Copies of the report cards required. Fees for the English language course: 1000 Euros per school year. Eligible students may get full scholarship.

## After this course

This English language course is coupled with a degree in Economics. Graduate students are therefore fully prepared to apply for any Master's degree in Economics, Finance, or Business Administration, or any graduate school in Economics.

Graduate students may also sit for the business schools' admission tests which require a bachelor's degree.
